Frostbiting

Hello fellow dinghy sailors,

Winter is only days away, and the weather sure has been cold enough, so it is time to kick off the Hampton Roads winter frostbite series for Lasers, Sunfish, 420s, FJs and other dinghies you might have kicking around.

The Sunday Series will kick off with two warm-up regattas, the first one on this Sunday, Dec. 12 and the second on the following Sunday, Dec. 19 (I know, technically before winter begins).

We'll take a break for Christmas, then begin the scored series the next Sunday, Jan. 2.

Here's what Leon Garber and I are planning for this season.

We will try to tighten up the racing, so it is not an all-day affair.

Skippers meeting at 11:30. First race at noon, and last race at about 2:00 to 2:30 depending on the weather and the fleet.

The races will be run according to the RRS. Short courses with mostly WLs and Olympics. Three minute starts. Competitors will be required to wear weather--appropriate clothes (wetsuit or drysuit) and a PFD.

Also, I am putting together a Laser borrow-boat. I just finished some glass work on it and I expect to have it completed by January at least. Though, if someone has an old radial or full they can chip in, that would great. My old class legal sail needs a clew repair before it would be safe to go out on the water in anything over a zephyr,

We do have permission to use the ODU Sailing buoys and a crash boat

As per last year, expect some coffee, waters and some breakfast treats or fruit

As of now, no race fee will be needed to support this series. If we are able to secure a charter arrangement with ODU, then there will be a fee for the rental and we did take donations last year to help pay for the ODU students who gave up a part of their weekend to come help us all out.

I look forward to seeing everyone again. It has been a long lapse since summer and the sailing has been great on the Elizabeth River.
