LOOP CRUISE April 15 -18

What a start to the cruising season – a relaxing trip down the Dismal Swamp Canal to Elizabeth City, then on to Coinjock returning back home on the ICW

Friday 4/15 evening: Waterside Marina

Try to arrive at Waterside by ~17:00

We will have a brief planning meeting when all arrive.

Dinner in town (Kincaids? or other) would be optional for those who wish

Saturday 4/16. Waterside to Elizabeth City

Because the Gilmerton Br is approx. 5 miles from Waterside and "opens hourly on the half hour", we will need to leave Waterside Sat AM by about 06:30 to make that bridge's 07:30 bridge opening and then motor (the few miles) to, and wait for, the 08:30 Deep Creek lock opening. We should be able to motor the 22 miles to the South Mills lock for its 13:30 opening, then the ~ 15miles to Eliz. City by ~ 16:00 for (any of 14, first come, first serve) free slips. This would leave the afternoon to "visit" Eliz City and ... " Around 4:30 pm boaters can visit Groupers Waterfront Restaurant on the deck for the Rose Buddie Reception".
