CBYRA membership number in the blank for CBYRA.
- CCV Their racing membership automatically enters you in all of their races for the season (except for Southern Bay Race Week); saves time, money, and headaches!! Worst case, join as a club member to get your copy of the annual racing bible (the CCV Racing Guide) to have information on every significant race in this area. http://www.ccvracing.org/Membership/membership.html. 2015 Cruising Club of Virginia (CCV) *Racing Guide* - known as "The Guide" to southern bay racers is a very good publicity vehicle for any southern bay race event. *The Racing Guide* is published annually by CCV and a copy is provided to individual sailors who join the club. Most boats that race at all on the southern bay carry a copy of this helpful tool. Most clubs that administer race events on the southern bay publish at least a NOR in the *Guide*. CCV sponsors 8 [+ or -] days of racing throughout the southern bay season and, of course, those events are published here, too.

To submit your NOR for publication:

- Email the NOR/announcement in final form to me at mcbear@earthlink.net please send as a Word attachment, if possible
- IF you published with CCV last year and would like a copy of your 2014 page(s), let me know email mcbear@earthlink.net or 757-850-4225
- Remember, your 2015 CBYRA Sanction numbers (where applicable) are on the 2015 official schedule.

On the next page is the final version of this year's two week cruise. This year's cruise will also see members of Hampton Yacht Club Sail Boat Cruisers join us, as well as we will also incorporate the Sailstice Cruise (Mary Greblunas is the Cruise Captain) for those that can leave a little earlier. The Sailstice Cruise was a lot of fun last year and I would strongly recommend it to anyone, and I plan on doing it again. Following the Sailstice Weekend we will make our way North, as far as Annapolis this year, via the Solomon's and then onto St. Michael's. We will then slowly meander south, stopping at a Country Inn on Tilghman Island and eventually making it to Cape Charles City Docks for the 4th of July Celebration.

I have made block reservations in Annapolis and St. Michaels, but there are also good anchorages or mooring balls in these locations for you to choose what you would prefer to do. A few people have already indicated to me they would prefer to stay on the hook in these locations

Boat for sale: Independence

Graham Field is selling his boat, Independence, for \$13,000. She is an Islander 36. Boat has capacity of 200 gal of water, new stainless 30 gal fuel, new strut, new cutlass bearing. The below information is reposted from the flyer at Hampton Yacht Club:

New 0.75 oz spinnaker and an older 0.6 oz spinnaker

New Dacron racing mainsail

Several jibs in excellent condition, and a staysail and a blade

Several other sails (jibs, spinnakers, and a drifter) for practice and Wednesday night races.

The diesel engine (Westerbeke 28 HP, model 308, 3 cycle) was recently refurbished, cleaned and painted. New engine mounts, new strut, and a new cutlass bearing were installed. The block and heat exchanger were flushed; the oil and antifreeze were replaced. The mast was recently refurbished (by New England Spars): the lower 3 feet of the mast, the mast step, and most of the blocks on top were replaced. The hull has been repainted with VC-Offshore. The deck and cockpit were repainted. The folding prop was rebuilt by Martec. The boat has a handheld GPS, depth finder, and knot meter. The wind vane and instruments are all new (wind speed, apparent wind, and wind direction). The boat has two batteries, one new and the other is two years old. The VHF has been replaced. All exterior nav lights (running, anchor, and bow) are in good working condition. The boat has a sun awning that covers the deck from the mast to the backstay. The boat has 12 PFDs, cockpit cushions, and a Danforth anchor. The interior cushions have never been used. The galley is equipped with a 3 burner alcohol stove and oven. The canvas of the dodger and bimini are not in good shape and need to be replaced. The boat does not have a dinghy.
