Post Event Review of the BBSA's Broad Bay Regatta (June 25th), from Jerry Pattenaude:

2016 DINGHY REGATTA



This year's dingy regatta was well attended with 19 boats registered - 18 started. One boat tore it's sail before the 1st start and was unable to compete. The race was attended by various types of boats: Lasers, Catamarans, Foiling A Cats, a Mobjack and a Taser. It was an absolutely gorgeous day, with air temps near 80 and winds blowing 10 to 12 NE for all 5 races.

As a catamaran sailor I felt as if I died and went to heaven. This was one of those perfect sailing days. A day where at almost any time while beating to weather you can bring in a little more sheet and gracefully lift a hull. From there it is a balancing act 5 to 7 feet above the water cruising around 15 knots with not a care in the world. (except port tack boats). While on a broad reach the leeward hull drives effortlessly thru the chop sending white water sprays over the rear transom with the nose diving every so often like a dolphin playing in the bow wave of a cruising boat. At that moment I find myself sitting on the rear beam holding on for dear life, tiller in one hand and the main sheet in the other being eased in and out to find that perfect balance for speed. The adrenaline that is racing thru my body and the exhilaration I feel are one of the main reasons I love this sport. There was one moment in time

while sailing away from the finish line that I asked my crew Jim Weixel if we should just continue sailing on for a while and catch up with the race later. He just smiled! Then my brain kicked in and we turned about to get ready for the next race.

This weekend we got 5 races in thanks to the professional manner in which the races were executed. I heard the competitors give Scott Almond, who was the PRO, accolades for races well run. On the race committee boat to help were: Art Quarnstrom, Andy Spittler, Linda Unger, Bill Pardee, Charles Brockley, Jean Pattenaude, and Joe Lieberman.

I want to give a big thank you to Art who also stuck around after the races and grilled up the hamburgers and hot dogs for the awards party afterwards. This really makes it feel like a club.

Without the above volunteers this race would not have been such a success. Thank you everyone! And as everyone knows, behind every good man is even a better women. Thank you Vice Commodore Jean for all your efforts behind the scenes. You are the best:)

He first learned how to sail when he was a midshipman at the Greek Naval Academy. After his last command on board a warship in 2006, he started cruising and racing every summer in the Aegean and Ionian Seas where he did several thousand miles.

When serving in Virginia, from 2013 to 2016, he completed successfully all ASA certifications up to 108 offshore ocean passage level and became an ASA instructor up to 205 level. During this period, he also cruised and raced in Chesapeake Bay the Carribean Sea and the Pacific Ocean.

He also holds a Master of Science degree in Electronic System Engineering and he has been teaching electronic warfare, radar and communications systems since 2000 at a post graduate level.
