Details and the notice of race are posted on the website and the sailing instructions will be posted as well my May 15th. There will be starts for all PHRF classes as well as Cruising, CHESSS, CRCA, and CMA starts; PHRF N class will be sailed with 1 headsail. Awards will be presented at BBSA's infamous Potluck Dinner Meeting at Rebel Marina on May 22nd. Hobie Fleet 32:

This is looking like a new year to the fleet as far as race and event schedules! Unfortunately, the Duck Cup (Duck, NC) was cancelled due to new construction on the site, but Jon promised to run the race again next year when the new facilities are complete. This is a Fleet favorite and I recommend everyone plan on making the grand re-opening!

We decided to skip the Sail the Bay Regatta this year because of the bad luck we have had in the past three years. This is our flagship event that is scheduled for the last weekend in May at Seashore State Park. We have been plagued with bad weather and equipment break downs, so it seemed like it was time to take a break and regroup. We thought it would be a better idea to focus our energy on building membership to the beach cat sailing family and decided that the Raven Rookie Race would be the best event to attract new sailors.

The Raven restaurant has been sponsoring this event for over 20 years by providing swag to fleet members and rookies. We typically try to run a rigging/safety seminar for new sailors and then a quick racing seminar. We have not been able to actually run training races recently, but the event has taken a turn to more of a general sailing seminar. Last year, we were blessed with zero wind, so we took the opportunity to hold a righting seminar. Every catamaran sailor is concerned with righting their boat after capsizing, but they never get a chance to practice in a controlled environment. We were able to flip a boat on its side in shallow water and let everyone learn how to right their boat! We have also provided boat handling seminars to help new sailors learn valuable skills like tacking, beach launching/landing and general sail trim.

It has been suggested that we change the name to not emphasize racing because catamaran racing could be very intimidating to new sailors. Most rookies are really only interested in figuring their boat out, anyway. So, I'm proposing to change the name to: (Drum roll, please...) "The Raven Rookie Sailing Seminar." Yes, not much thought went in to that one, I welcome all suggestions for anything better.

We will hold the seminar July 7th with a rain date of July 8th. We welcome ANY sailors, whether you own a beach cat or not to attend! If weather permits, we can get you on a fleet member's boat to experience the thrill of catamaran sailing.

On top of the Raven Rookie Sailing Seminar, we are planning on several Family Fun days throughout the summer to build participation and morale. We have had great success sponsoring poker runs, general family sailing days and a watermelon race. The watermelon race has everyone except one boat starting with a greased watermelon. The object is to navigate a course and to not be the one to return to the beach without a watermelon. Oh, you have to drop your watermelon at each mark, round the mark and pick it back up. You can pick up any watermelon (or several). This is very fun and it is a great way to practice man overboard drills as well as boat handling skills.

We are hoping that these events will lead up to greater participation in our Labor Day event, the 'Version 2.x' regatta. This event is very similar to the old 'Low Rent' regatta in that we use the islands (channels) of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel as navigational points. This is an exciting and challenging race! It will get you hooked on distance catamaran racing!

Hope to see Lots of new faces on the beach this year!

Races: A Skipper's Meeting will be held at 9:45 a.m. Three (3) races or more are scheduled with the first warning signal at 11:00 a.m. and for the Hampton One Design Class, any combination of races can be used to make up past regattas as announced at the Skipper's Meeting.

Rendezvous: Racing is planned to be on an outside course west of ODU off of Bolling Avenue light in the Elizabeth River, and/or on an inside course at the mouth of the Lafayette River. Location of the course(s) will depend on specific wind conditions.






