Anchoring:	The East River is generally protected from any long fetch (waves),	
	but not wakes. There are a lot of nice areas for kayaking and	
	dinghying. This area is where high schools run crew races in the	
	spring. If we are lucky, we might see some crew practice in the	
	channel.	
Social Activities:	We will have Happy Hours at 5 pm on Saturday and Sunday.	
	Saturday will be docktails on Weisert's deck. After docktails, we	
	will have a potluck dinner with bring and grill your own meat.	
	Bring a side dish or dessert to share (including serving utensils).	
	Bring your own plates and eating utensils, etc.	
	Saturday we will have Southern Peach Ice Tea (fortified with Jim	
	Beam) and some wine. Please bring your favorite hors d'oeurves,
