COMMODORE'S CORNER

Hello everyone! We made it through June, summer weather has arrived and things are turning around a bit! I managed to get 12 days out on the water in June. My days included one offshore trip from Southport, NC to Annapolis, Md (about 300 miles), move another boat from Annapolis to Deltaville, raced BBSA races with Ed and Aimee Darling on Amara, Andy Spittler on Wharf Rat and with David Hughes on Jammin, sail check on a catamaran, a quick fun sail on David Taylor's Andrew's 27 Wham Bam with our past commodore Guy Sorenson when the CCVR Solstice Race was canceled due to storms. I rounded out the month working on the signal boat and doing scoring for the BBSA Annual One Design Regatta and the Wolcott Memorial with Scott Norman at Norfolk Yacht and Country Club. Scott and I had a great weekend working together in the combined club event that Jerry Pattenaude organized with Eddie Wolcott, and Bob Magoon helping on a mark boat. Jerry was kind enough to take me for a spin on his Shark catamaran when we ended the BBSA Annual day. 15 years ago I was racing against Jerry in the Virginia Beach Hobie Fleet. I referred to this boat lovingly as the "salad bowl" boat while I chased it around the race course. We have talked about me sailing with him on it for years and we were able to finally make that happen. It was a blast in wind that was blowing 12+. Thank you, Jerry!

Our cruisers are leaving their marina docks to enjoy destinations on our beautiful Chesapeake Bay. I have seen their smiling faces in the marinas as they are coming in and out and I couldn't be happier!

On the racing front, after some back and forth with the race waivers everyone needed to sign, our club along with the other area clubs have all attention focused on being out on the water as sailing resumed. People seem to be taking the appropriate safety measures that they feel comfortable in both groups, which is good. I would hate to hear of anyone sick and in the hospital. I think I can speak for the other Commodores and all race organizers in the area that it was a huge relief to be moving closer to normal. It was disappointing that the first big PHRF race in the area, CCVR's Solstice Race needed to be canceled. Carrie Cutter and John McCarthy made the right decision to cancel because they couldn't send the fleet out with the lightning that came in a storm just a few hours later. Fingers crossed we have nothing else big cancel due to weather going forward.

My hope for July is that the state's decision to go into Phase 3 holds and we do not backtrack. In phase 3 groups of 250 people can congregate with appropriate social distancing. This would mean that with board approval we could potentially have some social events and move closer normal. This month will

bring us more organized cruising, weeknight races, and the early signup deadline for the Cape Charles Cup, which is going to be a great event for both cruising and race boats. Other keelboat events include CCVR's Plantation Light Race and Norfolk Yacht's Dink Vail Regatta. For all events, please check calendars and club websites often. All event organizers are tweaking formats to try to fit events better into Virginia's phase 3.

As always, if you need help getting back onto the water please reach out. Our local sail lofts and riggers are back at work. I have had several workdays where multiple sailmakers and riggers are working in the same marina. Your local people are ready to help you! If you would like a team sail training on Zoom or someone to sail with you, let us know and it can be arranged. Jimmy/Doyle,

HRBT construction Plans 6-4-20

I wanted to share some Information with the Club we have received from HRCP (Hampton Roads Construction Partners) on the new Tunnel Project.

In February this year, Curt Hauger, Rob Duncan and I met with their Public relations delegation to gather Information on the project as it relates to our Boating activities. You can currently see some activity in their lay down (Staging) area adjacent to Rebel Marina and on the South Tunnel Island Ft. Wool area. There will be docking structures by the old pier structure off the Willoughby North channel and directly outside the Breakwater opening to Rebel and Willoughby Harbor Marina.

Inside Willoughby Bay, off the I-64 Trestle will be a Quarantine area for storage of Large Marine equipment, Cranes, Barges and such. It will be a row of Large pilings and a marked area to keep marine traffic outside of this storage area. Equipment will be stored here mostly in Bad weather events for protection and will intrude in our Willoughby Racers normal upwind course to some extent.


Later this summer and Fall you can expect to see growing traffic around the two Marinas from these construction activities. This project is estimated to take 7 Years and will likely benefit from some well needed Maintenance at least on the North Channel leaving Willoughby Bay.

This is currently the Largest Construction Project in our State at \$3.3 Bl and will provide some interesting (If you like that stuff) Construction Equipment for Boring the Tunnels, and they are currently using Border Collies to keep nesting Birds from doing so in the Construction areas.


Curt and I will be in contact with their representatives throughout the Project and anything we need specifically can be obtained easily. So far, they are a good group to work with.




