

COMMODORE'S CORNER

I hope July was a great month for you as it was for me. July gave me 17 days on a boat. I fulfilled a goal from when I became commodore by joining the July 4th cruise to Cape Charles and finally cruised on the Chesapeake Bay. I sailed with my friends Paul & Dorothy Clifford and David Taylor on the C&C 37 Wind Dancer. I loved it and want to continue cruising the Chesapeake. As soon as we got home, I jumped off the boat, took a shower, hopped in a car, and headed for Oriental, NC to deliver a Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 36i with BBSA member and my dear friend, Jay Thompson. Jay and I have been working together on boat deliveries for Norton Yacht Sales and Latell Sailmakers for a couple of years. We spent a day in the ICW from Oriental to Beaufort, NC, and headed out on the ocean. This delivery was exciting with a tropical storm on our heels and an autopilot ram cylinder that pushed through a bulkhead because there were no reinforcements. We taped cans of vegetables together to brace the ram cylinder

in place to have one night of autopilot and with better storm watching. It is a good story. If you see Jay, ask him about his selection of vegetable cans that held for 15 hours until they became compressed. It is one of our more creative boat delivery stories that rival a delivery we did from Bermuda. Once home, I hopped off of that boat and drove to the Atlanta airport, picked up a sail shipment, and immediately went home to Bay Point Marina. I arrived 10 minutes before boat time to race with Andy Spittler on Wharf Rat. From there I have raced with David Hughes on Jammin at Willoughby, David Taylor on Wham Bam, sailed on a women's day sail out of HYC, delivered Tripp 38 Voodoo 2 from Deltaville to Hampton, worked on a mark boat for a one-design regatta, and on a coach boat for an Opti regatta to help out my 8 yr old buddy Henry Latell in his first regatta. I finally got a little "me" time at my family's river house playing on powerboats and jet skis with my childhood friends and my best sailing friend David Taylor.



One unfortunate thing July brought was a storm on a Wednesday evening during Little Creek's racing. Chris French's wind instruments reported 60+ kt wind gusts. We have had a debrief on the event. Some things broke, there was 1 man overboard and some lessons were learned. We have looked at safety guidelines for storm mitigation. The man overboard event was handled well and there were no serious injuries. I have offered in the past to help boats with MOB drills and boat safety. All people wearing an inflatable vest should wear it inflated in the water to understand how it behaves. I own an inflatable that does not flip me over if I am face down, which turns it into a "body recovering device" if I am unconscious or injured and cannot flip myself over. After using it without crotch straps, I know my unconscious or injured body can slide out of it. Safety equipment has evolved and new protocols are put into place every so many years. The takeaway from that night is that we can continue learning to be safer. Many crews do not know how to recover an unconscious or injured person. Please reach out to me if I can help you with MOB, finding a pool for PFD practice or anything safety-related.

BBSA is doing well even with the challenges that 2020 has brought to us. The Governor dialed us back from COVID-19 phase 3 to COVID-19 phase 2.5 right after I sent out a note to all of you to let you know

that we would not have membership meetings for now. We absolutely cannot make any changes for gatherings until we get into phase 3 or phase 4. I am happy to report that members who I knew were COVID-19 positive are now negative or are doing well. I will continue to look forward to seeing all of your smiling faces at a future BBSA event. Enjoy your August and stay safe out there!

LWMCCC 14-16 August 2020 Last Chance To Join Us Is Noon Aug 10!

Skippers: In Case some of you are still waiting!!

The time is drawing near to get signed up!

Sorry: late entries will not be able to order any regalia, and may only get a bag (no hat or shirt).

This year's LWMCCC will be 14-16 August 2019, in case you have missed the news on Facebook's local sailing clubs' sites and my past emails. We hope you still come join us on the water!

There are presently 5 mulithull, 5 CRCA, 18 Cruising, 19 PHRF A-C, and 9 PHRF N boats signed up, for a total of 56 for this year's race.

Entry Fee \$95. to noon 10 August

Note: late entries will not be able to order any regalia, and may only get a bag (no hat or shirt).

\$50 entry fee for any boat and skipper that together have never entered this race before (we know you'll come back after your first Cape Charles Cup). Pass this on to your sailing friends!

To adapt for COVID-19, we will not race to Cape Charles this year.

NOTE: THE RACE FORMAT HAS CHANGED, eliminating Cape Charles as the Saturday destination. Instead we substituted two distance races: Saturday starting off Ocean View/Little Creek and Sunday starting near Thimble Shoals Light, the race courses allow skippers from Little Creek, Willoughby, HYC, etc to remain in their home marina on Saturday night; additionally the start/finish is fair for all of these locations.

We are planning a modified Skippers' Meeting on Friday, August 14th at 1830. It will be held on the lot at 4317 Pretty Lake Avenue, Norfolk, at the southeast corner of Shore Drive and Pretty Lake Avenue.

The format for the meeting has yet to be finalized but will comply with the CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) Guidelines of the Commonwealth of Virginia in force at the time of the event. There will be beer and wine and water for the Skippers plus 1, but no food, sorry.

LCSA Series 2 Race 1 - the wake-up call

On Wednesday, July 22, 2020, the LCSA skippers and crew started preparing their boats for the race starting around 5:00 pm. It was very hot and humid with low to moderate breezes predicted. Most of us checked the weather and our radar apps and nothing looked unusual. Gradually, boats headed out into the Bay and gathered around the race committee signal boat, Baserunner.

Everyone was testing their starts and jockeying for position as usual. Meanwhile, a lone gray cloud appeared on the horizon in the westerly direction of Willoughby. It looked like it might be passing south of us, but even if it didn't most of us who saw it thought it could be, at worst, a brief rain event. Most of us just assumed we would get wet, but not a bad thing in this heat.

As the start time approached, the clouds started growing but they did not seem to be moving toward us. Just growing. With winds blowing at roughly 10 knots from the SW, they did not seem to be increasing much, so we stuck with our assumption of a rain event. Larry Lewandowski on Lew's Cruise announced that he had seen lightning and decided to abandon the race, but most of the boats, including Baserunner, did not see lightning. We proceeded with the race.

Right around the first start at 6:30 pm, the wind suddenly gusted up to 20 knots or more. It caught several boats off guard, but we still thought it was just a temporary gust. Eventually, by the time the second start sounded, the wind was blowing hard and steady. Sometime around 6:37 pm, the wind increased sharply. The race committed clocked steady winds between 30-35 knots, and abandoned the race. After that the winds increased and Baserunner registered 52 knots and Elixir reported winds at over 60 knots. NOAA reports later said the wind gusted from 45 to 60 knots. Baserunner attempted to contact each of the 15 boats that checked in but was unable to reach a few that went in early and Sea Goat, who was later contacted.

Every skipper was suddenly busy trying to control their boats steerage and bring down sails. Coeur D'Alene skipper, Hank Giffin, reported that he temporarily lost control of his boat due to extreme winds. He was not alone. The rains hit us like a "white squall", as Alan Moore described it, and visibility dropped to about 20 feet. The waves built quickly and further away from shore, Wharf Rat was surfing downwind in 6 foot seas. Rain came down so hard it was difficult to see, because you could not open your eyes when facing the wind.

The good news is that our skippers all handled the situation well and the squall did not last very long (~20 minutes). No one was hurt, but we did have lots of sail damage and some rigging damage. Two crew members fell overboard from Quicky. One was able to climb aboard immediately, but the other was in the water for about 10 minutes. Retrieval was a challenge because of the excessive wind speeds and the stinging rain that blinded everyone on the boat, but Mike Veraldi did an incredible job of retrieving the final crew member who was remarkably calm and composed.

Selo Qejvani, on Sea Goat, had difficulty getting his sails down and could not turn the boat, so ran aground just west of East Beach. Fortunately, no one was hurt, and the crew was able to get the boat back off the sand after the storm cleared and the tide started to rise.

Six days later on Tuesday evening, July 28, 2020, we held a one-hour Zoom meeting to discuss what happened with an interest to learn from this experience and make adjustments for the future. We heard from three skippers about their personal experience, and we all talked about what we would do better next time. Bob Magoon, our BBSA Racing Captain, will take the lead on improving our documents related to safety and safety equipment, while Stephanie Sweeney, the BBSA Commodore, will organize a training initiative for "person over board" training.

Big preliminary takeaways:

- Constantly monitor the weather from a reliable source, but recognize that squalls can appear suddenly and may not appear on radar, so keep watching the sky.
- If you don't wear your lifejackets all the time, at least put them on if you see a storm approaching.
- Make sure your crew can retrieve a crew member that has fallen overboard by practicing this
 drill multiple times during every season. Note that it is very common that the personoverboard is usually unconscious so this retrieval can be physically challenging, especially if you
 have a high freeboard.
- Designate in advance at least one other crew member who can operate the boat if the skipper falls out of the boat
- Check your VHF radios to be sure they are operating properly.
 You can test on the Sea Tow Automated Radio Check Service on VHF channel 28 in Hampton Roads. During high winds go below decks, if possible, so that communication can be heard.
 Changes under consideration, to be performed prior to start, include:
 - requiring radio check-in with the RC
 - o checking in with the RC by passing by the stern of the RC signal boat and hailing boat name and/or sail number.
- Practice reducing sails within one minute during calm conditions so that you can do this when the winds and waves are more challenging.
- Reduce sail early in a race by reefing, dropping or furling. Releasing a reefed sail when the
 winds abate is much easier than reducing sail when the winds are building quickly
- Review the required safety equipment and add anything missing.
